Look back over your notes from this message. Which point or points really struck home for you? Why? How can you commit to changing that area of your life, starting this week? *Ask God to help you apply this week's message to your life! Pray for the people you've invited.*

Tuesday

Please read Matthew 7:13-14 and Matthew 18:1-4. The people of Jesus' day were expecting the "gate" to the kingdom of heaven to be huge and obvious and full of splendor, like the massive temples in ancient cities. Instead, Jesus keeps describing the kingdom of God with words like "small" and "narrow" and "like a child." Which misconceptions was Jesus correcting? How is God's kingdom small? How is God's kingdom narrow? Why must we enter like a little child?

Thank God today that he led you to the narrow path! Remember to go on in total humility before him, because it is by his grace, not your efforts, that you are saved!

Wednesday

Please read Matthew 7:15-20. Once someone has been enshrined as a leader, many people are reluctant to criticize or find fault. But Jesus says that, in fact, we should be more discerning about our leaders than anyone! According to these verses, are false leaders obvious?

What will false leaders do to the sheep? To avoid false leaders, what must we do? This implies that we know the leaders well enough to see the fruit of their lives!

Pray for discernment about the leaders you are following—at church, in the culture, among your friends, and at your place of work.

Thursday

Please read Matthew 7:21-23. According to these verses, will everyone enter the kingdom of heaven? What will Jesus say to those who do not enter? What did these people quote to Jesus as evidence that they should be let in? What are you basing your eternal security on: your good deeds, or the fact that you know Jesus? If you haven't already done so, settle the issue right now! Talk to God and say, "God, I need you and I want to know you and experience your love for me. I want to be known by you as a committed follower of Jesus. I believe Jesus died on the cross for my sins. I believe he rose from the dead. And I want him to be my leader—my Lord—and my Savior.

Thank God that he promises to save us when we turn to him in sincere understanding of our need and his provision!

Friday

Please read Matthew 7:24-27. It's so easy to build on the wrong foundation. Even Christians can appreciate Christ's teachings, yet actually base their lives on values imported from the surrounding culture. Which of these "false foundations" appeal to you?

Rethinking My Life (Matthew 7:13-29)

Key Verse: “...everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.” (5:24)

Four Wise Choices:

1. Take the right _____

“Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it.” Matthew 7:13-14

2. Follow the right _____

“Watch out for false prophets. They come to you in sheep’s clothing, but inwardly they are ferocious wolves. By their fruit you will recognize them... A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus, by their fruit you will recognize them.” Matthew 7:15-20

In Matthew 23, Jesus describes leaders with “bad fruit”:

- Overly authoritarian (vv. 1, 8–12)
- Issue burdensome commands (v. 4)
- Love attention, titles (vv. 5–7)
- Convert people to a system (vv. 13–15)
- Focus on precise rules, not big picture (vv. 23–24)

3. Have the right _____

“Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. Many will say to me on that day, ‘Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and in your name drive out demons and perform many miracles?’ Then I will tell them plainly, ‘I never knew you. Away from me, you evil doers!’” Matthew 7:21-23

4. Build on the right _____

“Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.
